Title of Proposed Session: Engaging Local Entrepreneurs on Solving Development Challenges

Summary of Proposed Session (100 – 150 words): Using broad brush strokes, panelists will attempt to paint a preferred future vision for Egypt within both the MENA region and the world at large. Concepts of proactive entrepreneurship, human ecology and long cycles of capital accumulation will form the backbone of the discussion which should offer a re-framing and paradigm shifting of major issues and a fresh new look at current situation.

Albert Einstein once remarked that "Problems can not be solved at the same level of awareness that has created them in the first place". Egypt, with a population fast approaching 100 million living on an area half the size of Denmark and importing close to 70% of its food supplies, needs a new level of awareness to address its problems.

60% of Egypt's population is below 30 years of age, have never been empowered to contribute to the economic activities or the political scene despite the huge economic opportunity that they represent. The session will try to answer how the World Bank can empower local entrepreneurs to shape a preferred future for Egypt and create a win-win-win situation for MENA, US, Europe as well as the global economy.
